Coaches' Corner

Mothers' Meet-ups

This is a significant and recent initiative that is wildly successful. The first meet-ups were hosted in Arasampattu by Coach Kavitha and Udaipur by Coach Joshila. We invited all the parents of our participants to come together for a presentation and discussion.

These meet-ups enable parents (mostly mothers) of Playquity girls to unite and discuss their daughters' progress, and share concerns and challenges they may be facing.

Such opportunities to hear directly from parents will be incredibly valuable for us to and understand their perspective on program and the participants' wellbeing.



Coaches' Corner



Home Visits

Similar to the Mothers' Meet-ups, Coach Anjona is implementing Home Visits in Chabua. The coach visits the homes of the girls we support to discuss their progress and any challenges they may be facing. These visits are essential to building a strong relationship with the girls' families (intergenerational, typically), and allows us to provide support and assistance as needed.



The home visits and parent meetings are designed to solicit active family participation in our programming so that we are always working closely with the community. They allow us to share success stories and learn about potential issues. By building a strong relationship with parents, we are tailoring Playquity programs that address the needs and expectations of each unique community we work in.



Coaches' Corner

Summer Camp

In Auroville and Arasampattu, Coach Selvi and Coach Kavitha hosted summer camps for their communities. The camps were a great success, and the girls enjoyed a range of activities, including frisbee, nature walks, reading, and team-building exercises. They provided an opportunity for the girls to build their self-confidence, make new friends, and develop new skills.

Academic support

Finally, we've been able to provide academic support to the Playquity girls in Chabua and Arasampattu. Coach Anjona and Coach Kavitha work closely with the girls to identify areas where they need additional support, and provide guidance on reading and homework. By providing this space, we hope to give these girls the tools they need to balance school and Playquity.

Welcome to the family, SPS!

We are thrilled to announce our tenth Playquity partnership with Samaj Pragati Sahayog (SPS), a non-profit working towards women's empowerment, water, and livelihood in the central Indian Adivasi Belt. SPS has been working since 1990, inspired by the late Baba Amte's vision of social justice.

SPS's slogan, "everyone contributes their best for the success of the whole," reflects their values of compassion, balance, gratitude, humility, and forgiveness. They have been working in the districts of Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra for the last 30 years, empowering around 55,000 women, including 14 federations of women, through various initiatives such as self-help and solidarity.

We are particularly excited about their joyful approach to bringing change through sports. Many women in the communities they work with have never had the opportunity to enjoy sports. As part of their collaboration with us, SPS will focus on menstrual health while implementing the Playquity modules.

The intended outcome of our collaboration is to make women stronger and give them agency in their lives, making them the backbone of their society.

During the second week of May, our team visited SPS to kickoff the partnership and introduce 40+ women to Ultimate Frisbee. We are thrilled about the possibilities this partnership presents and look forward to working together to make a meaningful impact.



Impact

Our coach, Joshila from Mount Abu and the Kshamtalya Foundation shared her inspiring experience of learning how to ride a bicycle during the Playquity Academy 2022. She overcame challenges and mastered the skill, and now is teaching Coach Hansa how to ride a bicycle as well.

Rashmi was introduced to Playquity as a participant during an training session with the Rural Volunteer Center in Assam. Similar to other girls and young women in her community, she faces many obstacles in continuing her education. Despite her family's financial constraints and her father's hearing impairment, Rashmi displayed curiosity, enthusiasm, and dedication.

Today, she is a Coach In Training and is actively implementing the Playquity project in her village, Buristi Nalapara. Her story exemplifies the transformative impact of our initiatives on upcoming women leaders.





Looking Ahead

This summer, we are beginning our partnership with Kickoff Solution's Rural Girl Coach project in Chabua, Assam.

The ambition of the Rural Girl Coach project is to enable an ecosystem at the grassroots that builds the capacities of female sports coaches in order to maximize the potential of young female athletes within and beyond sport, while changing the perceptions of key grassroots stakeholders towards the participation of girls in sport.

As leader, Coach Anjona will play a crucial role in organizing and implementing the initiatives of the Rural Girl Coach Project. Her passion for ultimate Frisbee and commitment to empowering girls in her community will drive the project forward. She will be responsible for training and mentoring the girls, helping them develop their skills, and fostering their personal growth. The collaborative effort of Kickoff Solutions and Playquity have a strong foundation for success.
